YCB: The chief executive read a letter which detailed disciplinary actions taken by the Quaid-e Azam League involving players who also play in the JCT 600 Bradford League.

Naeem Ashraf (Baildon) was banned from all cricket for five years from April 1, 2010.

Kez Ahmed (East Bierley) was banned for one year from April 1, 2010, with a further two year suspended ban to come into force from April 1, 2011.

Adam Patel (Pudsey Congs) was banned for two weeks from April 16-April 30 2010

Action: The Chief executive to write to Baildon, East Bierley and Pudsey Congs informing them of the bans which apply to all cricket.

All umpires receive feedback on their assessments from captains and 14 people are attending the latest training course with four committed to become JCT 600 Bradford League umpires.

A request was made for the meeting regarding disciplinary tariffs and procedures to be delayed until the New Year.
